Shelter In Place **During A Chemical Emergency**

What is it? What do I need? What do I do?

A chemical emergency may occur anywhere hazardous materials are manufactured, stored, or transported. Chemical plants are obvious sources of potential accidents. Less obvious are highways, railways, and storage containers at places such as swimming pools (chlorine), etc.

You and your family need a **HOME EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT.** Store your kit in a convenient and secure place known to all family members.

The situation in your area may involve unique circumstances. Your county's emergency managment office can provide you with more information (see below for contact info).



Move to your shelter room indoors taking all family and pets with you.

Close and lock doors and windows.

Turn off the air conditioners, fans, heaters. Close the fireplace damper.

Seal all openings like air vents, doors or windows with plastic and tape or damp towels.


Turn on the radio or television for instructions.

☐ Take your emergency kit and a phone with you to your shelter.


When authorities announce the end of the emergency ventilate your home.
