OpenGov is a platform that offers cloud-based software for public sector budgeting, reporting, and open data, powering more effective and accountable governments.

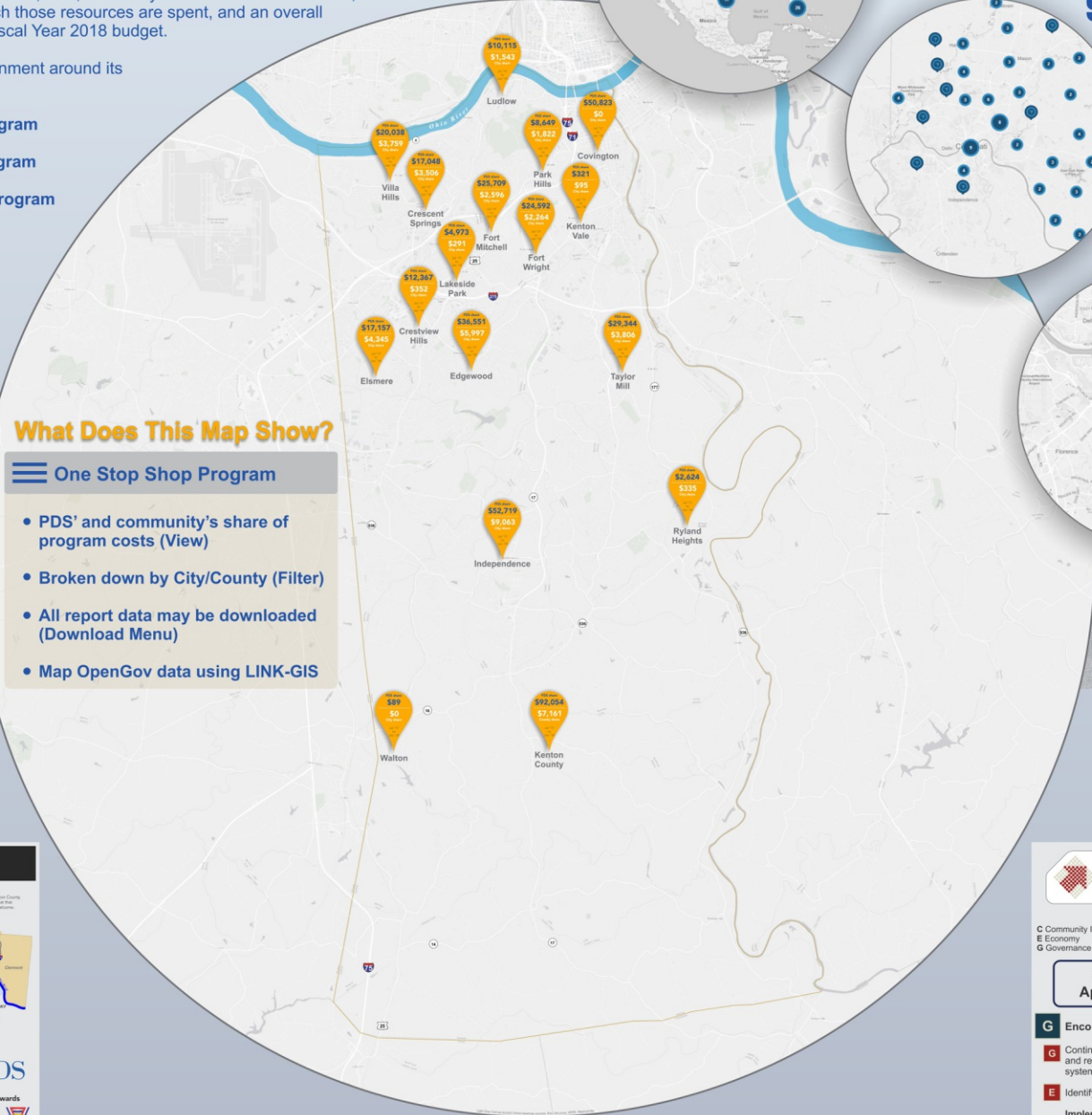

Implementation: PDS' One Stop Shop program unites the codes administration responsibilities of many of Kenton County's local governments under one roof. The program is built on PDS' "critical mass" of professionals, providing economies of scale that are impossible for local jurisdictions to match and levels of service local jurisdictions can't afford.
